Guidelines for Management of COVID-19 Related Waste

➤ CPCB issued Guidelines on 19/03/2020. Later first and second revisions done on 25.03.2020 and 18.04.2020 respectively.

Scope of Guidelines

- > Handling of biomedical waste generated from;
 - ➤ Hospitals / Isolation wards treating COVID-19 patients
 - Quarantine Camps/Homes
 - Sample Collection Centers
 - Laboratories
- > Responsibilities of persons operating Quarantine Camps/Home-care;
- ➤ Duties of Common Biomedical Waste Treatment Facility (CBWTF);
- Duties of SPCBs/PCCs;
- Responsibilities of Urban Local Bodies and options for management of general solid waste and biomedical waste from quarantine Camps / Quarantine Homes / Home-care

Responsibilities of various Stakeholders

CPCB

- To issue guidelines;
- Monitor and report status of compliance;

SPCBs/PCCs;

- Ensure disposal of COVID-19 biomedical waste in the State as per BMWM Rules, 2016;
- Use Tracking App to report status of management of COVID-19 biomedical waste;
- Coordinate and follow-up with State Government Departments;

Departments of UD and Health

- Create awareness about precautions to be taken by waste handlers/ workers
 / operators as well as citizens;
- Provide orientation/training to waste handlers;
- Ensure adequate protective gear to waste handlers.
- Ensure regular collection of solid waste and biomedical waste from Quarantine camps / Quarantine homes / Homecare / Isolation wards.

Action taken by CPCB

- Prepared Guidelines for Handling, Treatment, and Disposal of Waste Generated from Treatment / Diagnosis / Quarantine of COVID-19 patients.
- Held review meeting with SPCBs/PCCs on 30/04/2020 for evolving strategies for compliance;
- Developed Tracking App (Mobile and Desktop) for tracking of COVID related biomedical waste;
- Given demonstration to SPCBs on Tracking App on 06/05/2020;
- Held consultations with subject experts for revision of guidelines.
- Disseminated Information through CPCB website and Social Media Platforms.
- Developed Pictorial guidelines. Assisted other organizations to develop media content for awareness.
- Compiling daily status reports submitted by SPCBs (Tracking App / E-Mail)

Status of Management of COVID-19 related BMW (as on 25/05/2020)

- No of CBWTFs receiving COVID-19 BMW About 180
- Approximate Quantity received per day 42 tons/day
- States initiated using Tracking App TN, Punjab, Odisha, Haryana, Telangana, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, UP, Himachal Pradesh and Maharashtra

Action Points for States /UTs

- Ensure proper segregation of solid waste and biomedical waste;
- Ensure daily lifting of solid waste from hospitals treating COVID-19 patients;
- Usage of CPCB's COVID-19 BM Waste Tracking App;
- Monitor and ensure scientific management of deep burial pits;
- Compliance to CPCB Guidelines;
- Provision of PPEs to waste handlers;
- Provide awareness and training to waste handlers on safety aspects and use of PPEs;
- Submission of compliance report as on 31/05/2020 to CPCB by 04/06/2020 (NGT Matter OA No 72 of 2020)
