Hon'ble Member Secretary, MPCB, Mumbai has issued officer order vide letter no. BO/JD(WPC)/PH/B-210330-FTS-0055 dated 30/03/2021 for panel formation as given below for the public hearing.

Mr. Ajit Patil, Sub-Regional Officer, Maharashtra Pollution Control Board, Chandrapur and Convener, Public Hearing Committee on Environment welcomed the dignitaries on the stage and the citizens present online through Zoom App. He also requested the permission of the chairman of the committee to start a public hearing on the environment. At that time, he said that both the Hon'ble Collector and the Hon'ble Additional District Magistrate were engaged in important work in the context of Corona. The Convener of the committee requested the Hon'ble Collector to preside over today's public hearing. Thereafter, the Collector verbally suggested and ordered that, as the Chairman of the Public Hearing Committee on Environment, Shri. J. P. Londhe Deputy Collector (Rehabilitation), Collector Office, Chandrapur will look after the work. Thereafter Mr. J. P. Londhe Deputy Collector (Rehabilitation) appeared on the platform as the Chairman of the Public Hearing Committee on Environment and further proceedings were initiated.

First of all, the Convener, Public Hearing Committee on Environment, informed that the Ministry of Forests and Environment, Government of India, New Delhi, dated. 14/09/2006 and revised as per the notification dated 06/12/2009, it is mandatory for certain projects to get environmental consent and before that it is mandatory to hold public hearing on environment.

For the extraction of sand from 28 sand ghats in Chandrapur district, the project proponent Collector, Chandrapur on 11/02/2021, an application was made to the Maharashtra Pollution Control Board to hold a public hearing on environmental issues by paying the fee.

The Convener mentioned that the Sand Mining Frame Work, 2018 has been published by the Minerals Department of the Central Government in March 2018. In it, some guidelines have been given by studying some of the prominent states in the country regarding the matters required while extracting sand. Also Hon'ble National Green Tribunal (NGT) in accordance with the Order No. 368/2015 dated 19/09/2018 in coordination with the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi, to make favorable changes in the policy as per Sustainable Sand Mining Guidelines, 2016 and Sand Mining Frame Work, 2018 and 2020 instructions for holding a public hearing have been passed.

The Convener noted that the main purpose of the public hearing on environment is to make the general public in the project area aware of the project and its consequences, to inform the general public about the Pollution Control Plant binding on the project and related laws and to consider their suggestions.

The next 6 sand ghats in the polluted belt of Wainganga river in Bramhapuri taluka are proposed for sand excavation in today's hearing. Such

as, -Belgaon, Aherwargaon Chikhaldhokla, Aherwargaon Awli, Pimpalgaon, Halda, Kolari. Also, in today's hearing, the next 3 sand ghats in the polluted belt of Wainganga river in Savli taluka are proposed for sand excavation, such as, Sakhari, Londholi, Bormala.

Out of 28 sand ghats, 9 sand ghats are in the polluted belt of Wainganga river (Kolari, Belgaon, Arheranvargaon Chikhaldhokla, Arheranvargaon Awli, Pipalgaon, Halda, Lodhali and Bormala). . Dated 4/03/2021. It was mentioned in the advertisement of the public hearing published in Loksatta and Times of India. The reason is that if these 9 sand ghats are allowed for environmental reasons and sand is extracted from those sand ghats, then the order of Hon'ble NGT will be violated, said the Convener expressed by Mr. Ajit Patil.

M. P. C. Board in connection with the application for holding public hearing received by the Board, with the permission of Hon'ble District Collector, Chandrapur. A date was fixed on 08/04/2021 for holding environmental public hearing regarding sand ghats in Chandrapur District. As per the rules, an advertisement was published in the Marathi daily 'Lok Satta' and the English daily 'Times of India' on 04/03/2021 30 days in advance. Also, as per the notification, copies of the draft Environmental Management Report with prominent features related to sand ghats and information about the project were made available for study in Marathi and English in the offices mentioned in the advertisement of the Government.

After that the Convener stated the following 3 points in the tip in the advertisement in the newspaper. 1) The public hearing is being conducted online and offline. The Zoom App system is being used for the online system and the meeting ID is: 923 6837 1636 and the password is 543543. 2) Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, Government of India, New Delhi Circular No. F.No. 22-25 / 2020 - IA.III dated 14/02/2020 public hearing is being conducted online as per issue no. 3 (iii) in said order and public hearing is being conducted by gathering the citizens prescribed by the government, keeping social distance and following the relevant rules. 3) Citizens who are not able to use online system were also facilitated to be present at Niyojan Bhavan, District Collector's Office, Chandrapur, and accordingly 21 citizens were present in Niyojan Bhavan. 10 citizens participated in the zoom system online.

After that the project promoter - Smt. Alka Khedkar, District Mining Office, Chandrapur presented a detailed report (PPT Presentation) regarding 28 sand ghats in Chandrapur district. He also informed about the measures to be taken while controlling pollution while extracting sand.
